- 61% of Mississippi students attend schools with police.
- 60% of Mississippi students are in schools without enough counselors.

Our schools are falling short of providing even the most minimal recommended levels of student support.


STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Student Support Recommendations for Schools

- Increase funding for student support services, including mental health staffing and programming.
- Provide equal protection for students, ensuring school discipline and law enforcement involvement is administrated fairly.
- Ensure that law enforcement officers are provided with comprehensive and appropriate training.
- Adopt school codes of conduct that reject zero tolerance policies for more appropriate, child centered response to challenge behavior.
- End school arrests and law enforcement referrals that criminalize youth for common adolescent behavior, including misdemeanors like disorderly conduct.
